
### Winter Field Day Report

### **DFARG Monthly Meeting, January 17, 2019**

- 1. David Graham, our new President of DFARG, called the meeting to order. Twenty members were in attendance.
- 2. We began with the Secretary's reading of the minutes for the November Monthly Meeting followed with the BOD minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday, 15 January 2019. Both sets of minutes were accepted as read.
- 3. Dues for the new year are now due. Some twelve people have already paid to date. Hugh Sammons gave his Treasurer's Report for January 2019:

Opening Balance: \$1382.47

Income from Dues paid: \$484.00

Expenses/Gas: \$14.05

Total for January: \$1852.42

4. The purpose of the meeting was to share with the membership the planning session we had Tuesday night when the Board of Directors (BOD) convened.
