History of Ham Radio in Columbia (Fourth in a Series)

Ashmead Courtenay Carson is cited as the founder of the Palmetto Amateur Radio Club and, in fact, the club's callsign, W4MN, was first issued as Carson's call in 1929, and remained his call until his passing in in Columbia in 1941.

Carson was born on Homefield Plantation near Dalzell in Sumter County in 1876. He attended the University of South Carolina where he excelled as a student, being recognized as a distinguished student in his freshman, junior, and senior years and graduating with honors in 1898. He was an active member of the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity at USC until the legislature banned Greek Letter societies at publicly funded colleges in 1897. He was appointed as a lecturer in Physics at his alma mater, eventually rising to full professor and served for six years as assistant to the President of the University, Benjamin Sloan. Carson and several faculty members and students started PARC on the Horseshoe. probably in 1928 or 1929. He was known to have sponsored church services at Le-Conte College, on the Horseshoe, in which the sermon was transmitted via shortwave from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Carson was active in the South Carolina Academy of

Sciences, to which he was elected Vice President in 1935, and President in 1936. At the time he was elected Vice President, he demonstrated to the Academy a 5

meter transmitter which he had constructed, Carson's interests ranged far beyond ham radio. In 1901, he published observations of the growth n development of four opossum pups, and as an inventor, he held patents for typewriter attachment improvements, lamp socket extension plugs, and automobile glare shields.

Carson remained active in ham radio until his death. As noted in an earlier issue in November 1935 issue of *QST*, there is a note about the first annual hamfest sponsored by the Charleston ARC. Carson was listed as one of the speakers at the banquet, along with his protégé Bannie Stewart.
